

CALL FOR ORIGINAL PAPERS FOR THEMATIC SECTION

Child Socialization from the perspective of Integral Welfare and Fundamental Rights

Psicología, Conocimiento y Sociedad (PCS) is pleased to announce the call opening for original papers for its first ever *Thematic Section*.

Guest Editors: Magalí Reis (PUC Minas, Brazil) and Mariela Losso (Universidad Nacional de Comahue, Argentina)

Publication in: The Thematic Section will be published in the May 2021 edition.

Dates: Proposals will be received between October 30 and December 14.

The call for *Thematic Section* was open from June 22nd. to August 22nd. *The Socialization of Children from the Perspective of Integral Well-being and Fundamental Rights* was evaluated and approved by the Editorial Committee and two external evaluators. This proposal was presented by Magalí Reis (PUC Minas Gerais, Brazil) and Mariela Losso (Universidad Nacional del Comahue, Argentina). Below we share the abstract of this proposal.

ABSTRACT

The Thematic Section (TS) aims to compile results of research and practices on child socialization processes that promote contributions to the integral well-being of children from the perspective of Fundamental Rights promulgated in the Universal Declaration for the Rights of the Child, and the derived regulations. This TS will contribute to the analysis of institutions, practices, and ways of welcoming children, responding to all their vital and affective needs, prioritizing the principality of their rights. The TS will bring together studies from various disciplines that analyze the established and alternative cultural forms in the processes of socialization, considering the territories and social life of children. It includes the reality of the different States and the institutionalization of rights in practices and experiences in the diversity of social contexts and groups. The TS aims to constitute an academic contribution from the recovery, compilation and dissemination of research results and concrete practices that contribute to the analysis, projection and action for the benefit of new/other forms of guarantee of the rights and well-being of children.

Submissions

Manuscripts must adhere to the **Original Papers** section of PCS, which publishes papers presenting results of empirical research. Submitted manuscripts should be structured as follows: Introduction, Methodology, Results, Discussion, Conclusions and References.

All manuscripts should be unpublished and original work and follow the [Guidelines for Authors](#).

The review process will be carried out by peers according to the double blind review process.
